Each business or entity, including those that have been designated as essential under Empire State Development's Essential Business Guidance, must develop a written Safety Plan outlining how its workplace will prevent the spread of COVID-19. A business may fill out this template to fulfill the requirement, or may develop its own Safety Plan. **This plan does not need to be submitted to a state agency for approval** but must be retained on the premises of the business and must made available to the New York State Department of Health (DOH) or local health or safety authorities in the event of an inspection.

Business owners should refer to the State's industry-specific guidance for more information on how to safely operate. I. PEOPLE
A. Physical Distancing. To ensure employees comply with physical distancing requirements, you agree that you will do the following:
Ensure 6 ft. distance between personnel, unless safety or core function of the work activity requires a shorter distance. Any time personnel are less than 6 ft. apart from one another, personnel must wear acceptable face coverings.
Tightly confined spaces will be occupied by only one individual at a time, unless all occupants are wearing face coverings. If occupied by more than one person, will keep occupancy under 50% of maximum capacity.

	Post social distancing markers using tape or signs that denote 6 ft. of spacing in commonly used and other applicable areas on the site (e.g. clock in/out stations, health screening stations)
	Limit in-person gatherings as much as possible and use tele- or video-conferencing whenever possible. Essential in-person gatherings (e.g. meetings) should be held in open, well-ventilated spaces with appropriate social distancing among participants.
	Establish designated areas for pick-ups and deliveries, limiting contact to the extent possible.
	List common situations that may not allow for 6 ft. of distance between individuals. What measures will you implement to ensure the safety of your employees in such situations?
	In the classroom students may be seated less then 6ft from each other. Students must wear a mask for the duration of the class. Students will be provided with disinfectant and must clean their space upon arrival and upon leaving.
	How you will manage engagement with customers and visitors on these requirements (as applicable)?
	All visitors and perspective students will have to wear a mask. The temperature will be checked prior to any engagement with school employee. The visitors will be seated in the designated area 6 ft. away from the school's employee. The disinfectant will be used to clean the space occupied by visitor/perspective student when they leave.
	How you will manage industry-specific physical social distancing (e.g., shift changes, lunch breaks) (as applicable)?
	EDP School always practiced work in shifts. One morning shift and one evening shifts. EDP School will implement work in 3 shifts in order to have less people in the office at the same time. If employees will share an office, they will be positioned 6 ft. away from each other.
II. I	PLACES
	Protective Equipment. To ensure employees comply with protective equipment requirements, you see that you will do the following:
	Employers must provide employees with an acceptable face covering at no-cost to the employee and have an adequate supply of coverings in case of replacement.
	What quantity of face coverings – and any other PPE – will you need to procure to ensure that you always have a sufficient supply on hand for employees and visitors? How will you procure these supplies?
	EDP will have on premises disposable mask in case visitor/student employee does not have their own mask. Masks will be distributes as required. Disposable gloves will be available as well upon request.

	Face coverings must be cleaned or replaced after use or when damaged or soiled, may not be shared, and should be properly stored or discarded.			
	What policy will you implement to ensure that PPE is appropriately cleaned, stored, and/or discarded?			
	PPE provided by EDP school will be disposable (one time use). Visitors/students/employees that will use their own PPE will be responsible for cleaning reusable PPE.			
	Limit the sharing of objects and discourage touching of shared surfaces; or, when in contact with shared objects or frequently touched areas, wear gloves (trade-appropriate or medical); or, sanitize or wash hands before and after contact.			
	List common objects that are likely to be shared between employees. What measures will you implement to ensure the safety of your employees when using these objects?			
	Employees that share desks and computers/printers/scanners will be responsible for disinfecting equipment prior and after each use with disinfectant spray and/or wipes. Employees will NOT share equipment such as pens/pencils; everyone will have their own.			
B. Hygiene and Cleaning. To ensure employees comply with hygiene and cleaning requirements, you agree that you will do the following:				
	Adhere to hygiene and sanitation requirements from the <u>Centers for Disease Control and Prevention</u> (CDC) and <u>Department of Health</u> (DOH) and maintain cleaning logs on site that document date, time, and scope of cleaning.			
	Who will be responsible for maintaining a cleaning log? Where will the log be kept?			
	Provide and maintain hand hygiene stations for personnel, including handwashing with soap, water, and paper towels, or an alcohol-based hand sanitizer containing 60% or more alcohol for areas where handwashing is not feasible.			
	Where on the work location will you provide employees with access to the appropriate hand hygiene and/or sanitizing products and how will you promote good hand hygiene?

Disposable gloves will be used by staff to clean and disinfect. Surfaces will be cleaned with soap and and then be disinfected. Cleaning with soap and water will reduce number of germs, dirt and impuriti surfaces, and then be followed by disinfecting the area. Cleaning will be performed after each shift an every class has finished their respective studies. EDP School will use Disinfectants such as Lysol, Cle comparable brands that kills 99,9% of germs including COVID 19 virus.	
C. Communication. To ensure the business and its employees comply with communication requirements, you agree that you will do the following:	
Post signage throughout the site to remind personnel to adhere to proper hygiene, social distancing rules, appropriate use of PPE, and cleaning and disinfecting protocols.	
Establish a communication plan for employees, visitors, and customers with a consistent means to provide updated information.	
Maintain a continuous log of every person, including workers and visitors, who may have close contact with other individuals at the work site or area; excluding deliveries that are performed with appropriate PPE or through contactless means; excluding customers, who may be encouraged to provide contact information to be logged but are not mandated to do so.	
Which employee(s) will be in charge of maintaining a log of each person that enters the site (excluding customers and deliveries that are performed with appropriate PPE or through contactless means), and where will the log be kept?	
If a worker tests positive for COVID-19, employer must immediately notify state and local health departments and cooperate with contact tracing efforts, including notification of potential contacts, such as workers or visitors who had close contact with the individual, while maintaining confidentiality required by state and federal law and regulations. If a worker tests positive for COVID-19, which employee(s) will be responsible for notifying state and	
local health departments?	

III. PROCESS

A. Screening. To ensure the business and its employees comply with protective equipment requirements, you agree that you will do the following:	
	Implement mandatory health screening assessment (e.g. questionnaire, temperature check) before employees begin work each day and for essential visitors, asking about (1) COVID-19 symptoms in past 14 days, (2) positive COVID-19 test in past 14 days, and/or (3) close contact with confirmed or suspected COVID-19 case in past 14 days. Assessment responses must be reviewed every day and such review must be documented.
	What type(s) of daily health and screening practices will you implement? Will the screening be done before employee gets to work or on site? Who will be responsible for performing them, and how will those individuals be trained?
	If screening onsite, how much PPE will be required for the responsible parties carrying out the screening practices? How will you supply this PPE?
	contact tracing and disinfection of contaminated areas. To ensure the business and its employees apply with contact tracing and disinfection requirements, you agree that you will do the following:
	Have a plan for cleaning, disinfection, and contact tracing in the event of a positive case.
	In the case of an employee testing positive for COVID-19, how will you clean the applicable contaminated areas? What products identified as effective against COVID-19 will you need and how will you acquire them?
	In the case of an employee testing positive for COVID-19, how will you trace close contacts in the workplace? How will you inform close contacts that they may have been exposed to COVID-19?
